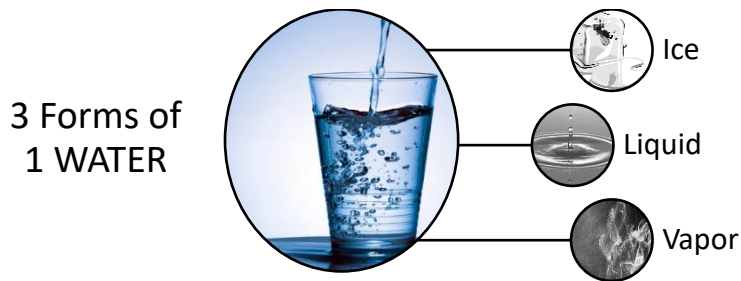

What connection can be made in 1 John 1:1-2 and the Gospel of John 1:-1-14?

“The WORD of LIFE” –Why is Jesus given this title?

Our words reveal 2 things about us, 1) what we _____ and 2) how we _____. Jesus reveals the _____ and _____ of God. To know Jesus is to know God. John is clear that the Jesus is God’s Son and to deny the Son is to deny the Father. (1 John 1:3; 2:22; 4:2-3). For Examples: Those who teach that Jesus was a good man but not God = ARE WRONG!

John teaches the fullness of God – (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) Trinity



Take time to Read and Study these Scriptures that support the Trinity:

1 John 4:2; 4:13-15; Matt 28:19-20; John 14:16-17, 26; 2 Cor. 13:14; Eph. 4:4-6

It is a life that has been experienced (v.2)

Personal Encounters. John over emphasizes that “I knew him”, I touch him, I saw him and I heard him. The apostles studied Jesus, however it was their spiritual closeness that mattered most. They committed to Jesus as Savior and as Lord. By their trust in Christ they experienced eternal life.

Experiencing New Life. John 3:3, 6-7. We can only experience new life in Christ after we have been “born again”, “born of the Spirit”. (1 John 5:9-13)

John’s Gospel tells people how to _____ eternal life, 1 John tells people how to be _____ they have it!

It is a life that has been shared (v.3-4)
